**QUESTIONS**

- Q: Contractor compensation: RFP pages 17-19, Options 1-4 ask for hourly rates for additional hours in excess of the priced total estimated hours. (Example: Option 1 total estimated hours of 28,360). The Legal Agreement, page 41, Section 3 Compensation states “not to exceed” dollar amount. The two are in conflict.**

**A:** The not-to-exceed compensation on the Agreement will include an additional contingency amount over and above the amount of the selected Bid Proposal. The additional contingency will be determined by SCLA staff to cover for any unforeseen expenses related to the agreement. No open-ended Agreement will be presented to the SCLAA Board of Directors; however the amount may be amended as necessary when agreed upon by all parties and approval by the SCLAA Board of Directors.

- 2. Q: Confirm this is a Fixed Fee contract (selected Option's Total Annual Billing sum). Monthly invoice, then, is that sum divided by 12?**  
A: This is not a "Fixed Fee" contract. The Total Annual Billing figures shall be divided by 12 to yield the monthly rate to be billed monthly in accordance with the selected Bid Proposal Sheet. Additionally, as indicated on the Bid Proposal forms, the fully-burdened hourly rates are to be included so that pre-determined rates may be billed for additional hours as required and requested by the SCLAA.
- 3. Q. Scope of Services, RFP pages 9-12: In the event the contractor has responded to a medical and/or structural fire and an aircraft incident occurs requiring an ARFF response, is the contractor liable for failure to respond? The RFP states for medical and structural fire responses the contractor cannot depart until relieved by the municipal fire department.**  
A: Although it is highly unlikely that such an event would occur, the SCLAA is aware that should ARFF staff respond to a medical aid or structure fire, it would not meet Airport Index at the time. However the contractor is expected to manage its resources to the best of its ability to prioritize appropriate responses.
- 4. Q: ARFF experience: please confirm that prior ARFF experience is not a prerequisite.**  
A: ARFF experience is required as described in RFP Section 3 (Scope of Services) Subsection III, A.3 & 6, C, Subsection IV and Attachment B.
- 5. Q: Does the ARFF station have internet capability for use by the contractor?**  
A: Yes.
- 6. Q: Are the current pay and benefits schedule available or the total annual compensation paid for ARFF services?**  
A: No.
- 7. Q: Will SCLAA or the contractor be responsible for the annual servicing of extinguishers?**  
A: The SCLAA will be responsible.
- 8. Q: Will SCLAA or the contractor be responsible for providing fluids for vehicle, i.e. oil, hydraulic fluid, etc.?**  
A: SCLAA will provide fluids for the vehicles.
- 9. Q: Will SCLAA or the contractor be responsible to conduct and pay for the annual apparatus test, preventative maintenance inspections, and for the maintenance cost on the fire apparatus?**  
A: SCLAA will be responsible.

**10. Q: Are ladders used and/or a part of the fire apparatus? If so, who will be responsible to conduct the annual ladder test and the cost for the maintenance and replacement of the ladders that fail the ladder test?**

A: SCLAA will be responsible.

**11. Q: Will SCLAA or the contractor be responsible for purchase of medical supplies used to provide BLS services?**

A: The contractor will be required to provide a list of medical supplies needed and the SCLAA will be responsible for purchasing them.

**12. Q: Will SCLAA or the contractor be responsible for the day-to-day supplies for the fire station?**

A: SCLAA will provide day-to-day toiletries and office supplies.

**13. Q: Will SCLAA provide a Breathing Compressor and quarterly air samples for the SCBA's or is this contractor provided?**

A: No.

**14. Q: Are duty uniforms (station wear) to be NFPA compliant, i.e. Nomex or FR rated?**

A: No.

**15. Q: Is there an SCLAA vehicle provided for the Chief to conduct the daily business of the ARFF department, i.e. traveling to airport meetings, visits with mutual aid partners, etc.?**

A: Yes.

**16. Q: Will the contractor be required to pay any costs associated with staff obtaining the Secure Area/Security Identification Display Area (SIDA) badge? Please provide initial issue and annual renewal cost per badge.**

A: The only badging cost the contractor will be responsible for will be the fee associated with losing a badge and requiring a new badge to be issued.

**17. Q: Is the contractor required to provide separate phone/fax lines for use for contractor business?**

A: Yes.
